

LRNG 193 - The Reflective Practitioner

Description

The Reflective Practitioner Workshop Most reveals to faculty how their overall level of wellness influences his/her teaching in profound ways. The "reflective practitioner" is a teacher who is mindful and present while practicing the art of teaching. Participants will learn what it is to be a reflective practitioner, exploring topics ranging from critical reflection to self-care, to psychological research findings on mental health and the classroom environment, thereby assuring a well - balanced personal and professional life.

Course Offering

Outcomes

Upon successful completion of The Reflective Practitioner workshop, participants should be able to:

- **Define** mindfulness, storytelling, and what it means to be a reflective practitioner
- **Identify** faculty life stressors
- **Discover** and **brainstorm** faculty wellness/wellbeing self-care disciplines and practices
- Begin to **cultivate** an ideal, personal healthy faculty life model
- Reflect upon and assess classroom environments through the lenses of faculty wellness
- **Embark** upon how to integrate mindfulness, classroom assessment techniques, and reflection exercise to **support** student psychological wellbeing; *utilizing* feedback to grow as a reflective practitioner

Completion Criteria

In order to receive a micro badge for the course, the following deliverables must be completed:

1. Satisfactory completion of three short reflection exercises, one activity sheet, and one self-care calendar (optional), as indicated in session.
